Major-Based Communities

EUROTECH ~ NEW! (Live: McMahon; Who can apply: FR, SO, JR, SR) Students in the EUROTECH program (double majoring in Engineering & German) will now have the added option to live and learn together (www.eng2.uconn.edu/EUROTECH).

Fine Arts (Live: Shippee; Who can apply: FR) School of Fine Arts students have the opportunity to connect with faculty and fellow majors to build a vibrant, cohesive, and diverse residential community for the arts.

Honors (Live: Buckley [FR]; Who can apply: FR, SO, JR, SR) Freshmen Honors Program students are placed in the 1st-Year Honors Residential Community which offers unique opportunities. The Brock Hall Sophomore Honors Community focuses on civic engagement. SOs/ JRs/SRs can apply for Wilson Hall Honors Housing.

Music (Live: South; Who can apply: JR, SR) Music majors can choose to live together to get to know each other and faculty better, while receiving support in their program.
